### GETTING TO KNOW BRENDA ELASAGHER BETTER!

## From Carol Larson and Darlene Hafner:



Brenda Elsagher is applying to the United Ostomy MBOD (Mangement Board of Director's) United Ostomy Associate Candidate for Second Vice-President.

We know her as a great friend, a leader and supporter of our organization, and a powerful and engaging speaker, who has blended humor with inspiration.

We're hoping our organization (OAMA) can get behind her and support her.

Darlene Hafner and I found out some other facts about Brenda you might find interesting. (Written below.)

When she was 21, Brenda bought her first hair salon and became a successful small business owner for 29 years employing over 100 people. There she learned marketing, accounting, human resources and janitorial skills.

After experiencing colorectal cancer at age 39, she became a performing comedian and within one year, she won the title: "Twin Cities Funniest Person" by ACME **Comedy Club.** 

At age 42 she began college and wrote her first book, *If the Battle is Over, Why am I Still in Uniform?* She got an "A."

She became too busy with comedy and writing to complete her business degree. She wrote her second book, *I'd Like to Buy a Bowel Please!* The stories collected in that book were from people with ostomies all over the United States and Canada. This is where Brenda began to learn about the various ostomies and continent diversions. Then she wrote her third book, *Bedpan Banter*. This book brought stories of humor and inspiration that took place in a medical setting. Soon she was requested to write a book about sex and intimacy. That became, *It's in the Bag and Under the Covers*. In this book, she interviewed people from around the world. Her last book, *Your Glasses are On Top of Your Head*, won the 2015 Minnesota Independent Publishing Award for Health and Humor.

Her accomplishments in these areas, speak for themselves:

- Member: National Speakers Association, National and Minnesota chapter for the last 12 years. Brenda is a present Officer and also has been their: Director, President elect, President, and Past President. She was awarded the Presidential Award for Outstanding Service and also has been a teacher in the Speaker's Academy for 4 years.
- Member: Association of Applied and Therapeutic Humor, (AATH) graduate of the three year program of the Humor academy as a Certified Humor Professional. (CHP)
- Conference Chair 2016. Coordinated 25 committees, planned the Annual National Conference with 58 speakers over a three day period. CEU Accredited. 275 people in attendance. Phoenix Arizona.
- Fight Colorectal Cancer Coalition: Advocate Participated 2 times in Call on Congress where the group was trained to meet with congress and urge them to fight for a bill to be passed that would allow all people regardless of income to be able to have a full colonoscopy. She was also the emcee of the event.
- Volunteer 2011-2018, Brenda was asked to be in 2 different Public Service commercials urging people to get their colonoscopies. One still runs 8 times a day on 2 channels for the month of March.
- Volunteer patient advocate for the American College of Sugeon's Oncology Group (ACOSOG): Brenda assisted in reviewing various research grant propsals giving a patient's perspective.
- **Get Your Rear in Gear**: Held in Minnesota. Biked and walked in 2 5K's, rode her bike in the Tour d'Tush. Brenda was awarded the Advocacy in Action Award for fundraising and awareness.
- Brenda has also volunteered to support numerous social service organizations. One in particular says it all about her devotion to the causes she has supported:
- St. Stephens' Shelter: For 3 years she slept every Sunday at the homeless shelter helping the needy for 3 years; distributing bedding, making breakfast, and cutting hair.

The people I've met, the personal conversations I've had, not to mention some pretty amazing experiences have encriched my life. I will always appreciate the medical professionals that helped me and especially the love, acceptance and answers I got attending my first support meeting at OAMA. I am still there to give that same support to others. I am grateful." She adds:

"My strength is that I am flexible, open, willing to learn, assertive, funny, welcoming and compassionate. My weakness is that I am flexible, assertive, funny and lose patience with ignorance, especially my own."

### Brenda wrote some closing comments to all of us:

If I am elected to the board, I hope to bring enthusiasm, new ideas, cooperation, a willingness to get projects done. I hope to try new things out of my comfort zone, to build a relationship with groups across the USA in a connected manner to the UOAA. If ultimately I become the president, I would want to represent the USA in an encouraging and hopeful role that will build continued stability for UOAA, like the immediate board has done. This will include urging the ASG's to get more involved and attend the biannual conference, and I'd expect fundraising as well. I want to continue to promote living with an ostomy or continent diversion with acceptance, gratefulness and encouragement. This has been my life mission already for over 20 years. And how to extend that good will globally if there are opportunities for that. I would want to build relationships with all the sponsors or potential sponsors in a way that shows no favoritism ans impartial appreciation for their support. I would hope to present myself in a professional, yet approachable manner.
