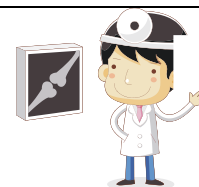

What on earth is an Appliance Fair?

You say you're not in the market for a new dishwasher or washing machine. Well then, what does it have to do with the Ostomy Association? Well, let me tell you how...

Going to the Appliance Fair is so helpful no matter how long a person has had an ostomy. New products are coming out all the time and this is a great opportunity to see them first hand and talk to the representatives who are full of information and advice.

Even though having a stoma is a common denominator for all of us, each one of us has individual needs and challenges when it comes to our ostomies. That's why it is so helpful and informative to come to the Appliance Fair. The ostomy supply companies that are at the Fair are more than willing to hand out samples so a person can try different products to meet their needs.

It is especially helpful to new ostomates. Usually when we wake up from surgery we see a large transparent pouch. It's transparent so the medical staff can notice any changes in the stool, blood etc. But when we get home, on our own, we are faced with all sorts of pouches, wafers, adhesives, powders etc. Usually we just go with what the ostomy nurse suggests. But as we become more aware of our bodies and comfortable with our ostomies, we may want to try new products and "experiment".

That's why the Fair is a great event to come to. You'll see a variety of products and get samples so you can go home and experiment on your own. I remember having such difficulty in the beginning with leakage and being allergic to a specific wafer. After attending my first Appliance Fair and trying a variety of products I was able to find a product that I can wear for up to 9 days with no problems.

Each time you go, you'll discover new products that you had no idea had even been thought of much less invented. You'll also discover items you *wish* had been invented. There will be sprays to kill odors, undergarments to assist us with our pouches as well as make us feel just a little more 'normal' if not even downright sexy, also covers for pouches which help with that sweaty feeling in the summertime. And goodness knows what else has been invented in the two years since we had our last Appliance Fair.

No matter if you're a new ostomate or one that has had one for years, you are sure to learn something new at the Fair. So, what a great way to spend a Monday evening: Great people, good food, samples of products, an opportunity to talk to representatives, and as always a chance to get to socialize with fellow ostomates.

In our OAMA group, talking about colitis, IBD (Irritable Bowel Disease) or bowel surgery is sometimes dinner time conversation but with commercials and public awareness, it's moving into the lunch time slot. Even for us, though, there is still a lot of mystery out there and it can be hard to know where to get information you want. Here, at last, is an event with some answers. 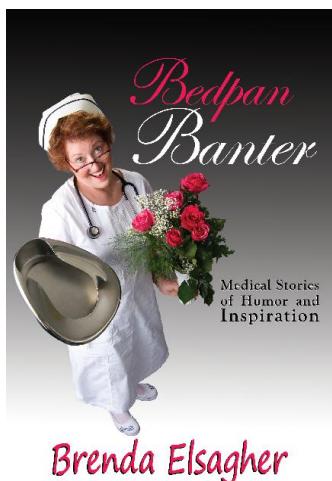
